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2018 Teller County Student Art Show Rules

Show Dates: Friday, April 13 through Thursday, April 26, 2018

Awards Presentation: Sunday, April 22 at 2 p.m.

*** Students must be present to claim awards ***

1. Students must follow all instructions.

2. This art show is open to all high school and middle school level students in Teller County including public, private, and home schooled students in Teller County. Students must be 18 years or younger as of January 1, 2018. Some age allowances may be made at the discretion of the Mountain Artists.

3. Ribbons, certificates and cash awards are awarded in each category. (No cash awards for middle school)

4. A student may enter only one piece per category, with a maximum total of six pieces.

5. All work must be properly framed or matted and must have an adequate wire or cord attached to the back and ready for hanging. (Artwork with improper hanging system will be rejected.)

6. Only original artwork created in Oils (traditional & water-mixable), Acrylics, Watercolors, Drawing, Mixed Media and Digital Design will be accepted into the show. The new category Digital Design is artwork produced on a tablet, PC, etc. and printed. Photography is not considered Digital Design. Class work accepted. No plagiarism. (Do not copy cartoon/comic book characters, etc.)

7. Size Requirements (Paintings & Drawings)

- o Image Size no smaller than 4" X 4" (Matted Size no smaller than 10"X10") (20 united inches) (Width+ Height = United Inches)
- o Finished Size no larger than 20" X 24" (including mats or frame) (44 united inches)

8. All artwork must be delivered to the Woodland Park Library, on Friday, April 13 between 2:30 p.m. and 5 p.m. *** No late deliveries accepted. ***

9. If teachers drop off artwork, the teacher MUST stay until everything is checked in and hung. Teachers must collect rejected items at check-in. If teacher drops off artwork, they must be responsible for collecting the artwork at the end of the show.

10. Attach a tag to the back of the artwork noting **student name, title of piece, category and teacher**. This is an extra measure to identify the artwork. The Mountain Artists will fill out another complete tag at the time of art intake.

11. All artwork must remain hanging in the show for the duration. No early removal of artwork.

12. Mountain Artists reserve the right to reject inappropriate artwork, such as graphic violence and explicit sexual content.

13. Awards presentation at Woodland Park Library – Lower Level – on Sunday, April 22, 2018 at 2 p.m. *** *Winners must be present to receive an award. If student, parent or family member is not present, the student will receive the ribbon and certificate but any monetary award will go toward next year's show. It would be disrespectful to all participants, the judges, the Mountain Artists if the winning artists do not attend the awards presentation. Much time and effort go into this show to benefit the young artists.*

15. In case of inclement weather, check the Library's Web Site <http://rampart.colibraries.org> for last minute changes or call 719-648-3245.

16. Students or teachers must pick up all artwork on Thursday, April 26 or Friday, April 27 during normal library hours. Unclaimed artwork will be collected by the Mountain Artists and then can be claimed for up to 10 days at a designated location. After that time, all unclaimed artwork will be disposed of at the Mountain Artists' sole discretion.

Sorry, no photography, 3-D work or non-original artwork. Judges may eliminate or combine categories if not enough artwork is submitted in a category. Students, teachers, administrators, sponsors and parents are strongly encouraged to support and attend the awards presentation.
